Hayman & Bond are both are members of the Women Printmakers of Austin, an organization dedicated to encouraging artists to actively pursue artistic expression through printmaking, and both are members of the Slugfest Print Studio. Selections from the Mexic-Arte Museum Print Collection

The Mexic-Arte Museum's Permanent Collection originated from the desire to share Mexican and Latino Art with the Austin community. The museum collects, researches, preserves, and exhibits a variety of art in order to enrich the community with the creativity and vibrant history of the culture. This includes a growing contemporary print collection with work from a large number of important artists, most of which have been generously donated by artists and collectors and encompass a diverse range of techniques and subject matter. In 2000, the Museum was designated the official archive of prints from The Serie Project, a nonprofit Latino arts organization that produces, promotes, and exhibits serigraph prints created by established and emerging artists. The Mexic-Arte Museum also houses the Ernesto DeSoto Print Collection, which consists of contemporary lithographs, fine prints, and etchings. Another collection is the Taller de Gráfica Popular Collection, which was a cooperative printmaking workshop and includes over 300 prints (etchings, linocuts, lithographs, and silkscreens) dating between 1940 and 1970.

Founded in 1996 as part of Lafayette College in Easton, PA, the Experimental Printmaking Institute (EPI) has had a special emphasis on publishing minority artists.
